I've been advised by our neighbourhood association that their simple request to defer a decision for a 4 way stop at Green and Frances Road has been denied.

While I don't live in the immediate vicinity of that intersection, I do live within the community, one block over where we have our own intersection concerns that have not been addressed.

Over the course of the last several years I've witnessed first hand how important it is to have a neighbourhood association that ensures the agenda reflects the majority of the community members' needs.
