



TRANSIT RETROSPECTIVE

- The HSR has <u>operated</u> in Hamilton since <u>1874</u> with the introduction of horse-drawn cars
- Over the last 143 years horse-drawn cars, electric streetcars, trolley buses, diesel buses, natural gas buses and hybrid buses have been used to deliver the service
- All the while, Hamilton's population has grown from 26,716 to over 536,917
- Hamilton's Transportation Master Plan envisions a city that "expand(s) transportation options that encourage travel by foot, bike and transit and enhance efficient inter-regional transportation connections."
- The capital plan as outlined in this presentation learns from the past and prepares for the future of Transit in Hamilton

Benefits of Public Transportation:


- Reduced household transportation costs.

- Provide on street infrastructure such as shelters and landing pads
- Provide the technology required to monitor the service and deliver customer information

- Corridor Capacity




