#### **ASST Certification**



The ASST certification initiative, developed by Public Works and Public Health staff, adapted the Canadian School Travel Plan model to help schools earn recognition for ASST efforts.



School Travel Planning (STP) is a community-based approach that aims to increase the number of children and adults choosing active transportation to and from school, thereby addressing environmental, health, and safety issues.


