

**RE-HOMING PLAN
FOR BIRDS AT AVIARY
CHURCHILL PARK**

1. Continue to operate the Aviary with a staff member overseeing the volunteers, who feed the birds and clean the cages, from 9 am to 12 pm every day.
2. Find temporary foster homes for four of the exotic birds, who will be moved permanently to the Gage Park Tropical House when it is completed.
3. On January 15, 2018, begin re-homing the rest of the birds with bird rescue organizations and individuals who are approved by Animal Control Services as animal foster homes. This will give the existing volunteers time to seek approval with Animal Control Services as animal foster homes that are able to care for one or more of the birds. In addition to meeting the usual requirements, including having appropriate knowledge and facilities and undertaking to humanely care for the birds, the organizations and individuals taking the birds will be required to:
 - not breed the birds;
 - receive permission from Animal Control Services before moving the birds, if that ever becomes necessary;
 - provide veterinarian care for the birds when needed; and,
 - provide annual updates on the birds to Animal Services.
4. Where possible, Animal Control Services will arrange for the temporary placement of birds until January 15, 2021, so that the birds may be moved to a private aviary subject to item 5. If such an arrangement is not possible for some or all of the birds, then Animal Control Services will arrange for a permanent placement.
5. If, no later than January 15, 2021, the volunteer community satisfies Animal Control Services that it has a suitable permanent private aviary, those birds that have been placed temporarily will be moved to the aviary and will become the property of the private aviary.
6. If, at January 15, 2021, the volunteer community has not satisfied Animal Control Services that it has a suitable permanent private aviary, the birds that have been placed temporarily will become permanently housed in their current foster home, or other suitable location to be sourced through Animal Services.
