Questions respecting Social Housing in City of Hamilton:

- 1. What parameters are used to plan where people with disabilities live?
- 2. What is the importance of the radial separation by-law?
- 3. What is the difference between a group home and a residential care facilities?
- 4. How is the licensing done for each facilities?
- 5. How are safety issues addressed for the most vulnerable people?
- 6. How could the neighborhood strategies help keep vulnerable people in their familiar areas?
- 7. How will administration for the coordinated access to housing in-house differ from the previous process?
- 8. Will the information binders be updated?
- 9. Will the application forms continue to have a geographical area format?
- 10. Will the special needs questionnaire be more sensitive to the range of disabilities (some people have more than one)?
- 11. Why is a doctor required to sign/fill out the special needs questionnaire?
- 12. Who will act as a liaison to help a disabled applicant apply for the most appropriate housing and corresponding support services?
- 13. Both the Housing First and Patient First programmes are geared for the most vulnerable people. How can the average person with a disability get housing and necessary services in a timely fashion? (Often priority status does not succeed until after the person dies)
- 14. When will an inventory of "accessible" units be available?
