Section 204 Subsection (12) stipulates "...if a vacancy occurs for any cause, the Municipality may appoint a person to fill the vacancy for the unexpired portion of the term and the appointed person is not required to be a member of the improvement area."

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

At a meeting of the Board of Management of the Ottawa Street BIA held on Thursday October 10, 2019 the Directors nominated Bill Cartwright for a vacant position on the BIA Board of Management.

Should Council adopt the recommendation in Report PED19214, the nominated individual would replace Sauro Bertolozzi who resigned from the Ottawa Street BIA Board of Management.
