2022 CEF Highlights

- Implemented a new online platform to further develop the fund to streamline processes for consistency, transparency and efficiency.
- Continue to evaluate the City Enrichment Fund's processes, documents, and support tools; EDI survey – Information reports back to Council, implementing data capturing in CEF application for next year, research with other granting bodies.
- Funding rationale: Returning to pre-pandemic levels (2019) to even the field during the past few years of instability and inconsistency in community programming
- Applying a consistent rationale in passed few years allowed for surpluses in certain areas
