- 2021-2025 Solid Waste Management Master plan action item: review current trash tag program to better align program with SWMMP guiding principles and determine recommendations for program changes
- Staff began a review of this program in 2023 that included a waste composition study on properties requesting additional tags and participating in the Special Consideration program, reviewing costs and staff time directly related to administering the program and researching programs in other municipalities



Current Trash Tag Program



Each household gets 12 trash tags in the mail along with the City's annual waste guide



Each household can request 14 additional trash tags once per year for free



Special Consideration Policy for following properties: medical circumstances, two or more children under the age of four, registered home day cares and agricultural



Once approved for special consideration, applicants are given extra trash tags at no charge (up to 104 extra tags, prorated)



Trash Tag Municipal Scan



13 Municipalities Scanned:
Regions of: Halton, Peel, Niagara,
York, Durham, Waterloo, Oxford,
City of: Toronto, London, Ottawa,
Thunder Bay, Guelph, District of
Muskoka.



All except Guelph and Ottawa use trash tags.

City of Hamilton is the only one to offer free tags.



11 municipalities have no limit on tags. Tags purchased through municipal website in nearly all locations.



Average cost per tag is \$2.33



Staffing Impacts: 0.8 FTE (additional trash tags) + 0.1 FTE (special consideration) = 0.9 FTE




Audit Results – properties that requested additional 14 tags



- 224 samples (two samples from most properties)
- Total weight of material audited 2,580 kgs



Audit Results – special consideration properties



- 102 properties audited
- Total weight of material audited 1,827 kgs




Audit Results – special consideration properties with two or more children under four



- 28 properties audited
- 572 kgs of material audited
- 13 of 28 properties had zero diapers in the garbage




Audit Results – special consideration properties identified as home daycares



- 30 properties audited
- 483 kgs of material audited
- 9 of 30 properties had no diaper waste in the garbage




Audit Results – special consideration properties with medical conditions



- 23 properties audited
- 411 kgs of material audited
- 13 of 23 properties had no medical waste in the garbage



Audit Results – special consideration properties identified as agricultural



- 21 properties audited
- 361 kgs of material audited
- 11 of 21 properties had no agricultural waste in the garbage
