Unsupervised Distribution of Illegal Drug Paraphernalia Including Needles and Crack Pipes

WHEREAS, the Greater Hamilton Health Network is initiating a pilot program where paraphernalia for illegal drug use including needles, crack pipes and meth bowls will be distributed without supervision through automated vending machines called "HealthBoxes";

WHEREAS, the Greater Hamilton Health Network is funded and regulated by the Province of Ontario;

WHEREAS, discarded paraphernalia for illegal drug use is a direct public health risk to families and children utilizing City parks, greenspace, and other public space; and

WHEREAS, cleaning up discarded needles, crack pipes and other paraphernalia for illegal drug use is a significant taxpayer expense and a direct public health risk to City of Hamilton staff who have the task of cleaning up after illegal drug users.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- (a) That staff be directed to write to Ontario's Minister of Health to:
 - (i) Request that the Ministry end funding for the unsupervised distribution of paraphernalia for illegal drug use, including needles, crack pipes and meth bowls as part of "Healthboxes":
 - (ii) Advise that Hamilton's Board of Health **DOES NOT SUPPORT** the unsupervised distribution of paraphernalia for illegal drug use in the City of Hamilton; and
 - (iii) Advise that Hamilton's Board of Health **SUPPORTS** best practices for paraphernalia for illegal drug use distribution under the supervision of a registered healthcare professional, support worker or other qualified individual where opportunities for education and referral to appropriate addictions treatment, health and social services are available.
