As we continue to face a growing need for affordable housing, it is crucial that we embrace policies that enable diverse, flexible housing options. By limiting ADUs to a single storey, we risk reducing the potential to provide much-needed housing in a way that is both sustainable and efficient. Two-storey ADUs offer homeowners the opportunity to maximize their available land and accommodate larger families or multiple tenants, without the need to build on more green space or engage in sprawling developments.

Additionally, limiting ADUs to one storey could have unintended consequences for property values, neighbourhood dynamics, and urban density. I believe that the restriction on two-storey ADUs is narrow backward thinking and does not address any of the the housing challenges we face.
