Good morning Justin,

We live next door to 13 Ravina Crt and received the notice of variance 8 days after the scheduled meeting date, and obviously were unaware this was proposal was put forth and being discussed.

We have concerns regarding the proximity of neighbours' home/structure to the property line. If this variance is approved, their structure will be even closer to a large tree. We do not want to be held liable for branches falling on their home or causing issues when having tree services completed etc.

Secondly, we are concerned about the drainage and run off of this proposed structure because how close their eaves and drainage would be to our property and home. In this area there are ongoing issues with drainage and would prefer to limit further issues relating to this problem.

There is also the concern about the increased risk of damage to our home should there ever be a fire at either property. There are large trees between the homes and with the proposed variance to give them more space, our structures will be closer and in turn, create more risk.

We understand their interest in a variance, but perhaps a single or a 1+ garage would be a compromise given the reasons outlined above, as well as other concerns from fellow neighbours you have received.

We are not looking to be disruptive to their plans and we have compassion for them as they are looking to complete this renovation, but we hope that these concerns will be taken into consideration.

We've been informed by a neighbour that there is a new date for the variance proposal on Thurs. March 27th at 1pm. Given the fact that all neighbours <u>received</u> the original letter from the city <u>after</u> the scheduled meeting, your office should be sending out another notice to update everyone. Considering the length of time it took to receive this correspondence, I implore you to use another way of sending this letter (personally delivered by a city of hamilton employee, or a quick delivery service) to neighbours who have a right to this information and to contribute to the discussion on March 27th.
