As one of the few remaining bike share systems in Canada, Hamilton Bike Share plays a crucial role in connecting the McMaster community with the city at large. Supporting and sustaining this system not only strengthens that connection but also helps Hamilton Bike Share thrive — delivering benefits to neighbourhoods across the city and helping put Hamilton on that map as a leader in sustainable urban mobility.
