

REPORT ILLEGAL DUMPING

If you see someone illegally dumping, make a note of the details and report it to the City of Hamilton. Do not approach the person.

Provide as much information as you can, including:

- Location of dumped material
- Description/photos of dumped items
- Make/model or license plate number of vehicle
- Description of people involved
- Any other information that you think would help
