While I fully support the importance of harm reduction strategies and recognize the need for safe and supportive spaces for individuals struggling with addiction, I do not believe public libraries are an appropriate setting for this initiative.

Libraries serve as vital community hubs for families, children, youth, students, and seniors. They are meant to be safe, welcoming, and inclusive environments that foster education, learning, and community connection.

Introducing drug consumption services into these spaces raises serious concerns regarding the safety and well-being of vulnerable populations who frequent our libraries. The presence of drug use, even when supervised, may inadvertently expose young library users to potentially distressing situations and undermine the sense of security these spaces are meant to provide.

I urge the City to consider alternative locations better suited for this critical public health service—ones that can meet the needs of individuals struggling with substance use without compromising the safe and educational environment that libraries are intended to uphold.
