

### Indicator definition

- Indicators define and explain dimensional changes. Multi-dimensional quantitative changes are reported in a tangible and measurable fashion.
- indicator's dimension (economic, environmental or Social), metric unit, Service Area and Person Most Responsible
- definition, including assumptions, what's included and not included
- alignment with 2022-2026 Council Priority and their Outcome
- City wide tracking, reporting tool and structure
- established Key Performance Indicators (target values)
- impacts to City revenue
- Existing data sources, reporting structure and how the data is used city wide

### Indicator's key features

- anticipated impact of LRT initiative (at different stages)
- tracking for a defined LRT area or more granular areas i.e. Influence Tracking Areas, at no additional cost, no additional resource implications
- if not tracked City-wide, any value to start tracking, assessing cost or resource implications
- reasonable baseline year and reporting frequency
- other factors that can lead to change
- investigate climate justice lens when assessing impacts on equity-deserving populations i.e. women, Indigenous peoples, persons with disabilities, member of visible minorities
