The McMaster Students Union recently conducted the Your City Survey to collect 500+ student perspectives on housing, transit, policing, safety, and retention.

Student Perceptions

"Downtown scares me..."

"I would prefer a safer downtown..."

"I don't feel safe enough to stay in Hamilton after graduation if I can help it..."

"I live in downtown Hamilton and I think that students who don't, have a very skewed and unrealistic perception on the ins and outs of actually living there. I have never felt unsafe, at, for example, Jackson Square..."

What's at Stake?

45%

respondents are not considering staying in Hamilton after graduation.

What can be done?

Respondents are at least



more likely to consider staying in Hamilton after graduation if they explore beyond the campus community

Recommendations

- The 10-Year Downtown Revitalization Strategy should allocate funding for student-led placemaking to activate public space, showcase local student artists, and create spaces Downtown that reflect the young residents of Hamilton.
- 2. The McMaster Students Union should continue to be included in consultation and engagement in the creation of the 10-Year Downtown Revitalization Strategy.
