I am writing to you to state my opposition to the development on Taylor Crescent. I have lived in Greensville for over forty years and my experience is that any development costs me money. They extended Oak Avenue and we had to have our well dug deeper. Then they extended Marshboro Avenue and we had to have the well dug deeper again.. More recently, they built Greylands and we had to have a new well dug in November 2022.. I understand from Murfin Brothers that there were several people in our area who had to have wells deepened or new wells at the same time..

I do not see why I and others have to pay out money every time a developer wants to build some houses or other structures in our area. Surely, this should be covered by the City or the developer? Do we not have any rights in this area? I understand that Riparian Rights apply to defined underground streams. Are our streams not defined, as we are extracting water from them and they would be fine if others didn't come in and take this water? In any case, it is well known that there isn't enough water for any more structures in this area. Many of the present residents are already experiencing water problems, such as not being able to do laundry at home. and new development will probably make this worse. I personally cannot afford to dig a new well. It was just under \$20,000 last time and I have been told that it is about \$30,000 nowadays. Also there may not be any water at all.

I would suggest that all development stop until a solution to the water shortage is found. It is immoral to take water from others for new development.
