RECOMMENDATION

 - (iv) Hamilton Mundialization Committee in the amount of \$5,890;
 - (v) Hamilton Status of Women Committee in the amount of \$3,500;
 - (vi) Committee Against Racism in the amount of \$3,890;
- (b) That, in addition to the base funding request for the Hamilton Status of Women Committee, one-time funding in the amount of \$5,000 be approved from the Volunteer Committee Reserve (Account No. 58300-112212).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In accordance with the process for submission of budgets for the Volunteer Advisory Committees, the Corporate Services Volunteer Advisory Committee budgets for 2011 in the amount of \$24,170 are being submitted with the recommendation that they be approved, as the budget requests are either in the same amounts as 2010 approved budget or funds are available for the increases from existing Volunteer Committee reserves.

FINANCIAL / STAFFING / LEGAL IMPLICATIONS (for Recommendation(s) only)

Financial: The base budget requested for 2011 for six (6) of the advisory committees is the same as the budget requested and approved for 2010. The Hamilton Status of Women Committee are requesting the use of \$5,000 from the Volunteer Committee Reserve.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (Chronology of events)

At their September and October meetings, the Corporate Services Volunteer Advisory Committees gave consideration to their budget needs for 2011. Their budget submissions are attached (refer to Appendices A to F to Report FCS11016) as approved. The budgets for the Advisory Committees include both incidental costs to support the committees, as well as, additional costs for specific events, programs and initiatives. The following is a summary of the requests and detailed requests are attached as Appendices A to F to Report FCS11016.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The Volunteer Advisory Committees are able to put surplus funds from one year into a reserve, for future purposes, and request the use of those funds in future years for specific purposes. This possibility gives the committees the chance to plan ahead to undertake specific projects or initiatives, in future years, while minimizing increases in their budgets. Several of the committees have not yet determined all of their activities for 2011. The Hamilton Status of Women Committee is requesting one-time funding from the Volunteer Committee Reserve in the amount of \$5,000. Should additional funding for any of the Advisory Committees be required in 2011 and be available in the volunteer committee reserves, requests for reserve funding will be made at the appropriate time.

RELEVANT CONSULTATION

Each of the Committees discussed their budget submissions at their September and/or October meetings.

ANALYSIS / RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION

The recommendation will provide funding of the operations of the Advisory Committees, so that they are able to continue to fulfil their terms of reference. The committees are not asking for increased base budgets. The Hamilton Status of Women Committee have requested approval for the use of \$5,000 from their reserve fund, for the purpose of continuing outreach and co-sponsorship of women's events with community partners such as the Muslim Women's Event, Take Back the Night and International Women's Day event. The Hamilton Status of Women Committee supports these events, with a focus on involving women of diverse background in the planning for and attendance at these events. They have at least \$9,457 in the reserve (2010 prior to year end balance).

ALTERNATIVES FOR CONSIDERATION

The alternative would be not to fund the operations of the Advisory Committees. This is not recommended as they provide linkages to the community, as well as valuable service and advice to the City, both Council and staff. They assist also in bringing voices to our deliberations that might otherwise not be heard.
