### RECOMMENDATION

- (a) That the Hamilton Youth Advisory Committee annual base Budget Submission in the amount of \$3,890, attached as Appendix A to Report CS11030, be approved.
- (b) That, in addition to the base funding, that a one time funding from the Volunteer Committee reserve, in the amount of \$2,500, be approved.

# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

As directed by Council, HYAC has prepared their 2011 Budget Submission, attached as Appendix A to Report CS11030.

## Alternatives for Consideration – Not Applicable

### FINANCIAL / STAFFING / LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

**Financial:** HYAC is requesting approval of \$3,890 for 2011, as well as an additional \$2,500 from the Volunteer Committee Reserve in order to enhance the *hamiltonyouth.ca* website, purchase promotional items, and to provide youth development, training and other collaborative opportunities to HYAC members and other Hamilton youth.

Funding for website development was budgeted for in both 2009 and 2010. The cost of *hamiltonyouth.ca* was \$3,460.74 including applicable taxes (\$1,730.37 in 2009 and 2010). Funds to cover these costs came from the Volunteer Committee Reserve.

The request for an additional \$2,500 in 2011 is to make anticipated design changes/improvements to the site and to upgrade some of the pages. An evaluation of the current website by the in-coming Advisory Committee will inform the plan for the website upgrades. Should the feedback from the evaluation indicate that no revisions are required; the funds would be retuned to the Reserve. There are sufficient funds in the reserve to accommodate this request.

**Staffing:** Staff from the Community Services Department will continue to act as liaisons to the HYAC.

**Legal:** There are no legal implications associated with the recommendations of Report CS11030.

### HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The Hamilton Youth Advisory Committee (HYAC) is comprised of a diverse group of young leaders 14 to 24 years of age who are passionate about making a difference in their community. HYAC's mandate is to ensure that youth are involved in the decisions made within the City of Hamilton and the community that affect their lives and the lives of their families and friends. HYAC provides a youth perspective on local issues and advises Council and staff through the Emergency and Community Services Committee.

Addressing issues facing youth, enhancing opportunities for youth and providing a youth voice are the goals of the committee. In addition to fostering positive collaborative relationships between youth and adults and by supporting youth oriented events and programs, HYAC aims to continue to lead by example with integrity, respect and innovation.

# ANALYSIS / RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION

Since its inception in 2007 by Council, HYAC continues to make significant strides as not only as a committee but as a conduit between other youth in the community.

Much of HYAC's work in 2010 consisted of advocating on behalf of their peers through reports to ECS and Council, networking with youth city-wide and raising the committee's public profile.

 Youth Poverty and Homelessness Report: HYAC members presented a report based on a walking tour taken in 2009 with a former street-involved youth. In their report, HYAC attempted to highlight youth facilitated actions several things to help their peers experiencing poverty and/or homelessness.

HYAC members supported and participated in various community events such as:

- Soupfest: Members attended Living Rock's event as a way to network with other community groups and to help support community initiatives who aid their peers who are experiencing poverty and homelessness.
- *Tim Hortons Team Up to Clean Up*: Members of HYAC joined other community leaders and issued a friendly challenge to their peers and other youth groups to participate in this city-wide clean-up event.
- Unfilteredfacts Summit: HYAC members learned the 'unfiltered facts' about tobacco, alcohol and the fast food industry, when they attended this youth-led summit organized by Public Health Services.
- Leadership Quest III: Members of HYAC teamed-up with youth from Public Health Service's to help design and implement a youth leadership camp.

HYAC continued to connect with youth city-wide by hosting two well-attended training opportunities for youth; *Influencing Public Policy* and *Improving the Health of Your Community.* HYAC's website, *hamiltonyouth.ca*, is now live and has received positive feedback from youth and adults. In addition, HYAC actively consulted with and provided feedback on numerous municipal and community based initiatives such as the Pan Am Games, the Hamilton Roundtable for Poverty Reduction, and City Beautification & Graffiti Master Plan/Task Force

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The 2010 approved budget was \$8,890, however only \$5,202 was spent. This funding was used for meeting expenses, team-building initiatives, volunteer recognition, communication, training, and other expenses related to the work of HYAC. The Committee used reserve funds to develop a secondary logo and a website; both to facilitate communication with and recognition by youth in the community. In the next term of Council, a city wide recruitment strategy will be initiated based on the input provided by current HYAC members. Additionally, the newly formed committee will continue to familiarize itself with the City of Hamilton and local government, as well as identify priorities and initiatives they wish to focus on during the next term.

# ALTERNATIVES FOR CONSIDERATION

If HYAC's budget is not approved in its entirety, the Committee may have to adjust their planned activities for 2011.
