As you are aware as of January 1, 2011 new regulations under the Nutrient Management Act and Ontario Regulation 267/03 that govern the application of non agricultural source materials (NASM) such as municipal biosolids to agricultural land came into effect. Part of the new regulation requires operators of NASM application businesses to ensure that spills contingency plans are in place in the event of unforeseen accidents and spills. Most of these contingency plans would include a source or contact information for hydra vac equipment such as that of Super Sucker Hydro Vac. The utilization of NASM within a farmer's crop fertility program is a valuable asset not only to the farmer but to area municipalities and their citizens. Protection of the natural environment is a key component of these NASM land application programs and access to the equipment necessary to clean-up spills quickly and efficiently if they do occur is vital. The equipment that Super Sucker Hydro Vac has within their fleet is well suited to not only clean-up of a spill but also the transport of the retrieved material to a disposal or treatment location.
