2012 Tax-Supported Operating Budget (City Wide) (Item 4.1)

Chris Murray provided an introduction to the budget presentation and indicated that the presentation would cover the following areas: the Council-approved guidelines, specifically focusing on what was approved in 2011; where we re now in terms of the Operating Budget and what is being worked on throughout the budget cycle and the remainder of the year in order to achieve goals; and information about the workforce and where we are with respect to people who are becoming eligible to retire. Human Resources staff will provide additional information with respect to retirements and the City's obligations in terms of benefits, etc.

In response to whether there are any "sacred cows" that are definitely "off the table" during the budget considerations, e.g., golf courses, retirement homes, front-line public services, et al, staff responded that Council previously provided clear direction that programs in these areas are not to be touched. The Committee requested that staff circulate a memo to remind them of what is not open for further discussion.

Councillor Whitehead suggested that the list of "untouchables" be revisited each year.

Within the discussions following the presentation, Committee requested that they be provided with the following information/material:

- (a) Options and alternatives as related to where the City is a member i.e., associations, organizations, to provide Council with an opportunity to understand the benefit or value to the City, and whether they should be maintained in terms of benefits gained over the years
- (b) How a building permit translates into tax revenue
- (c) Investigate other sources of revenue opportunities available through authority by the Province, review City of Toronto Act and similar legislation for the City of Vancouver for consideration during this term of Council
- (d) Want to see matrix that determines that the City is at the provincial average in terms of tax ratio
- (e) Investigate and report back on how the City might institute, within contracts, other ways of getting value for dollars i.e., snow clearing
- (f) 2002-2003 statistics of Ontario Works clients; 2005-2006 review of social services
- (g) Want to see total see total expenditure at the end of each line for end of the year per division, per classification (i.e., advertising)
- (h) Show breakdown by Ward rather than by former municipalities from the beginning of the process

(i) Request same data from all municipalities that have been used for comparison purposes in presentation with respect to provision of social services
