

What is a Blue Community?

The Blue Community Project calls on municipalities like Hamilton to:

- Recognize water as a human right
- 2. Promote publicly financed, owned and operated water and waste-water services
- Phase out and prohibit the sale of bottled water in public facilities and at municipal events

1. Recognizing water as a human right in Hamilton

- Safeguard against expensive water Hamilton has one of the lowest water rates in Ontario
- Provide citizens with information Hamilton has a campaign encouraging us to drink tap water. Ensure all residents have equal access to adequate supplies of safe, clean water. — Hamilton is doing this.
- Promote water conservation, treatment, etc. Hamilton is doing this too and recently won the Minister's Award for Environmental Excellence.
- Encourage our Federal Government to recognize water as a human right.
