#### RECOMMENDATION

That the "Freedom of the City" be granted to the 31 Signal Regiment City of Hamilton.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The granting of the "Freedom of the City" has been a long time tradition in the City of Hamilton dating back to the mid 1970's.

"Freedom of the City" is an ancient honour granted to martial organizations, allowing them the privilege to march into the city with drums beating, colours flying, and bayonets fixed. It is a symbol of trust and reward in return for dedicated duty.

Today, martial freedom of the city is an entirely ceremonial honour, but remains the oldest and one of the highest civic honours. It is granted by the local Council by way of a formal motion, followed by a special ceremony at a later date.

By way of Ministerial Order on September 1, 2011, the 705 (Hamilton) Communication Squadron was re-styled as the 31 Signal Regiment of the City of Hamilton.

As well, April 1, 2012 marks the Centennial of the Unit's founding as "No.1 Wireless Detachment, Royal Canadian Engineers".
