






#### Highlights of Joint Response

- Set funding model within an outcomes based accountability framework
- Apply an Equity based funding formula
- Capital funding decisions need to consider entire early years system with a focus on neighbourhood capacity
- Replicate Hamilton's 'Raising the Bar' quality assurance program





#### Highlights of Joint Response

- Ensure access to high quality service for children with special needs
- Harmonize standards and shared supports between child care and school boards where appropriate
- Develop a recreation based care model for 6 to 12 year olds
- Ensure provincial licensing process aligns with local service planning
