Council Direction:

At the December 11, 2012 General Issues Committee Meeting 12-024(b), the following direction resulted from discussions respecting the 2013 Tax Supported Capital Budget;

"That staff be directed to explore joint municipal opportunities for bulk purchases of capital equipment and vehicles such as fire trucks and land ambulances, and report back to the General Issues Committee on progress."

Information:

The Procurement Policy By-law contains a dedicated policy for cooperative procurements. The policy allows the City to jointly participate in contracts in coordination with other municipalities, academia, schools and hospitals (MASH sector) as well as government bodies, public authorities and conservation authorities. As well, the City may 'piggyback' on existing contracts that have been issued by these agencies where there is a provision to do so.

Many of the contracts that have been issued and awarded by the provincial government include provisions to allow agencies within the Broader Public Sector (BPS) to piggyback on its contracts. This type of provision is prevalent for those goods and services that are used corporate wide. Some examples would include desktops/laptops, cell phone carriers, print fleet, courier services and the like.

It has become practice to investigate these opportunities when a current contract is coming towards the end of its term and the City has taken advantage of these opportunities when there is a benefit to do so. Some examples of contracts that the City participates in include next day courier services, document shredding and Microsoft software products.

In other instances, the City has elected to award its own contract when a cooperative contract exists. This was the case for the print fleet contract. In reviewing the provincial agreement, the City found that these printers were of lower functionality that what the City required and therefore did not participate.

Each contract is reviewed on a case by case basis and where there is a benefit, the City has exercised its option to participate. A request was sent to all the operational departments to identify all joint purchases that the City is currently participating in and what contracts are being contemplated. A list of the cooperative purchases, that are currently in year or are in the process of being issued, is provided in Appendix 'A' to report FCS13089. There are 17 active cooperative contracts with an estimated annual spend of approximately 26.5 million dollars.

In 2005, the City also actively participated in the joint purchase of street sweepers with the City of Toronto, with Toronto being the lead agency in the procurement. The award of this purchase resulted in a reported savings of approximately \$300,000 (including taxes).

In collecting this information from the operational departments, it was noted that there are contracts that are currently being investigated, but not utilized at the present time. The contracts that are being contemplated include Cisco equipment, Information Technology Professional Services and computers.

As of 2010, the provincial government has made a conscious effort to make their contracts available to the Broader Public Sector. The City's participation has increased in the past few years as evidenced by the information reported in Appendix 'A' to report FCS13089.
