THE PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE PRESENTS REPORT 13-002 AND RESPECTFULLY RECOMMENDS:

- 1. Installation of Bicycle Racks/Storage at Municipal Facilities (PW13004) (City Wide) (Item 8.1)
 - (a) That the City's public-use facilities lacking a suitable bike rack, as identified in Appendix "A" to Report PW13-002, have an appropriate bike rack installed, to be funded from Transit Capital Reserve #108025 to an upset limit of \$20,000;
 - (b) That the City continue the standard practice of having the Department responsible for the facility to be responsible for the provision of bike storage at the facility.
- 2. Wastewater Abatement Program Changes and Sanitary Surcharge and Wastewater Abatement By-law No. 03-272 Amendments (PW13006) (City Wide) (Item 8.3)
 - (a) That staff be directed to amend the City of Hamilton Wastewater Abatement Program to reflect that the calculation used for determining potential eligibility for the program shall include water provided from the municipal water supply only;

- (b) That the City of Hamilton's Sanitary Surcharge and Wastewater Abatement By-law No. 03-272 be amended to reflect the changes to the Wastewater Abatement Program, in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor;
- (c) That the Director of Hamilton Water and the General Manager of Finance and Corporate Services be authorized and directed to discontinue receiving any new applications for an Abatement under the The Sanitary Surcharge and Wastewater Abatement By-law until after the By-law is amended to reflect the changes to the Wastewater Abatement Program.

3. Small Equipment Manufacturer's Standardization Renewal (PW08029(a)) (City Wide) (Item 8.4)

- (a) That a five-year extension for "Stihl" equipment as a manufacturer's standard for the purchase of string and hedge trimmers, chainsaws, leaf blowers, multi-purpose "Kombi" system engines and attachments, and other commercial grade small equipment for the Public Works Department, be approved;
- (b) That a five-year extension for "Honda" equipment as a manufacturer's standard for the purchase of walk behind lawnmowers, generators, water pumps, and engine components for lawn edgers, aerating equipment, rototillers, compactors, debris loaders, walk-behind leaf blowers, and other commercial grade small equipment for the Public Works Department, be approved;
- (c) That staff be authorized to negotiate "house accounts" for the supply of equipment and repair and maintenance service with "Stihl" and "Honda" manufacturers and/or licensed distributors of the approved equipment standards.
